Roadmap to Fun: The Spring & Summer Activity Guide from Janesville Parks and Recreation is here! Fiber Expansion Project: As our world continues to become more interconnected, the availability of broadband services has become more critical than ever before. This development is partly why in 2019, the City applied for grant funding through the State's Broadband Expansion Grant Program. The resulting fiber expansion project installed 144 new strands of fiber stretching over four miles. Fair Housing Advocacy: This April, the City is celebrating Fair Housing Month, a time dedicated to advancing equity in housing and increasing public awareness of everyone's right to fair housing. Pothole Patching: Potholes are an inconvenient side effect of spring in Wisconsin. The Operations Division works diligently to efficiently clear potholes of debris and fill them with patching material. In fact, in 2022, City crews filled 6,968 potholes throughout Janesville. Residents are encouraged to help crews fill even more by reporting potholes to the City. 
