We hope you enjoy the February edition of the City of Janesville's Community Advocate Update, filled with the latest information about exciting happenings here in Janesville!

WSCC Update: The City continues to update its Woodman's Sports & Convention Center (WSCC) <u>webpage</u> with the latest project information, including the most recent project update to City Council. The Friends of the Woodman's Center group have also launched a <u>Facebook page</u> and a newly redesigned <u>website</u> to further enhance community awareness and dialogue on the project.

Upcoming Election: The 2023 Spring Primary will take place on February 21. The community can prep for the polls by checking their voter information on <u>myvote.wi.gov</u>. The City Council has combined polling places for this primary election, consolidating from ten voting locations to five. Residents may also vote in-person absentee on weekdays through February 17. Voting takes place in the Clerk-Treasurer's Office on the second floor of City Hall from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., except for on February 17, when voting will continue until 5 p.m.

Black History Month: Every February, the nation celebrates the contributions and culture of African Americans. The City is proud to join in this recognition by sharing the stories of black residents like John S. Scott, Sr., who was one of the first black employees at the GM Janesville Assembly Plant. Scott also founded a local branch of the NAACP, chaired Janesville's Human Rights Commission, and volunteered at Mercy Hospital. The community is encouraged to learn more about Scott's extraordinary life at bit.ly/3Yg6EEO.

Hope Kits: The Janesville Police and Fire Departments joined in a collaborative initiative to combat the effects of fentanyl poisoning and opioid overdose through newly assembled Hope Kits. These kits, created using grant funds, contain NARCAN, fentanyl test strips, resource cards, CPR instructions, and a face shield. First responders in our area will be able to distribute these resources to those at risk of overdose. Volunteers Needed: Community members are needed to serve on City boards, commissions, and committees!
