A Resolution Endorsing Amendments to the 2023 Unified Planning Work Program for the Janesville Metropolitan Planning Area

WHEREAS, the Janesville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the MPO for the Janesville Urbanized Area (UA) and the Janesville Area Metropolitan Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, The Janesville Area MPO Policy Board has the responsibility to direct, coordinate, and administer transportation planning throughout the MPA; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration, 23 CFR and 49 CFR 616, have determined the necessity for a Unified Planning Work Program; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Policy Board of the Janesville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization approves the following amendments to the *2023 Unified Planning Work Program* for the Janesville Metropolitan Planning Area, as being consistent with the *Janesville Area 2020-2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan*; and the Janesville Transit System's *Transit Development Plan* of 2022:

- Rebalance expected staff hours budgeted to each work program element and overall hours budgeted to staff wages.
- Line-Item Description Revision #1: From "John Paul Road Bicycle Corridor Study" to "JTS Ridership Marketing Plan" and assigns an amount of \$20,000 for contract services.
- Line-Item Description Revision #2: From "MPO Hub Site: Public Engagement Tools Development" to "Municipal Lo/No Emissions Fleet Transition Study" and assigns an amount of \$16,000 for contract services.
- Extend the use of \$36,000 in 2023 funds into 2024, to be used by May 31st, 2024, to complete contract services for:
 - o JTS Ridership Marketing Plan
 - o Municipal Lo/No Emission Fleet Transition Study

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Policy Board of the Janesville Area MPO authorizes MPO staff to execute contracts, agreements, and other documentation necessary to carry out the 2023 Unified Planning Work Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with 23 CFR 450.334(a) Janesville Area MPO hereby certifies that the metropolitan transportation planning process is addressing major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements of:

(1) 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;

(2) In nonattainment and maintenance areas, sections 174 and 176(c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506(c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;

(3) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;

(4) 49 U.S.C. 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;

(5) Section 11101(e) of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Public Law No: 117-58) and 49 CFR

part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in DOT funded projects.

(6) 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
